In New Jersey, 52,000 or 7.71% of 12- to 17-year-olds report using drugs in the last month.

62.8% of 12th graders who used marijuana in the last year consumed it through vaping. Vaping nicotine is a gateway to using vaping marijuana.

4,777 Americans aged 15 to 24 years old died of an overdose of illicit drugs in 2019.
